## **Club Courtesy**

The last several issues of the *Waterline* have reminded members that it takes all of us to maintain our beautiful facility and that common courtesy is needed to ensure that we can all enjoy it.

### **Our beach and launch areas**

We have asked members to take responsibility for themselves and their guests and to treat the property with respect. The beach and launch areas were of particular concern. The beach is a natural area that needs to be protected so that we will be able to enjoy it for many years to come. The launch area is very busy and we requested that members use it for its intended purpose and not for parking cars or storing boats. As usual, our members have responded and complied with the requests.

### **Important RV guidelines**

Another area requiring common courtesy is camper/RV parking. Parking a camper/RV at the KSC should be considered a privilege, and treated as such. Please show courtesy to fellow members who may want to share camper parking by following a few simple guidelines as follows:

- 1) Park parallel to the clubhouse, not the shoreline. Pull or back in as far as possible to allow traffic to pass behind you. This will allow for more parking.
- 2) Don't open awnings and place chairs around campers if it will be a busy weekend. This takes up parking and we are not an RV park. You can use the beach and clubhouse to socialize.
- 3) Don't leave AC or other power on when you are not using the camper. Ideally, campers

should not be left on property unoccupied, but if they must be for a short period, turn the power off.

- 4) Clean up the area when you leave.

Remember that you may be the last camper to arrive at the club and the only way that you will have room to park is if your fellow members are courteous and follow the above guidelines.

### **Change to KSC Operating Policy**

In addition to these guidelines, at the September meeting the BOS adopted a formal change to the KSC Operating Policy as follows:

- Campers may be parked on club grounds on a temporary, short-term basis only.
- Campers may be parked behind the clubhouse, beside the dumpster and in the upper parking lot as long as they do not interfere with any member's dry storage. They may not be parked in the launch area.
- Campers abusing this policy will be instructed by the BOS to remove their camper from club property. Repeat offenders will be prohibited from using campers on club property.
- Any camper left on club property after request to remove by the BOS will be charged \$10 per day storage fee. This fee shall be treated as dry storage and failure to pay will be treated per operating policy.

The intent of this policy is to provide members an opportunity to enjoy the club with their camper/RV, but not to allow long-term use which limits the number of spots available, as well as detracts from the appearance of the club.
