RULE CHANGE FOR ELECTRICAL SYSTEM USAGE

“Without exception, all connections made to KSC electrical receptacles shall be U.L. approved weatherproof, three wire, grounded type. Wiring must be of sufficient amperage for its use as specified by the National Electrical Code. Extension cords used should be at least 12 gauge (AWG) and rated for outdoor use. Electrical equipment directly connected to receptacles by their integral (as purchased) cord of any size are acceptable as long as they have a ground wire (three pronged connection).

All severely weathered or visibly damaged cords must be replaced immediately. The KSC Board of Stewards retains the right to disconnect undersized or damaged cords upon discovery.

All electrical equipment connected to dock receptacles shall be disconnected at end of the day unless the user is remaining on the premises during the duration that such connections are installed. Any permanent or extended connections must be approved by the safety or facilities chair person and will be reported to the KSC Board.”
